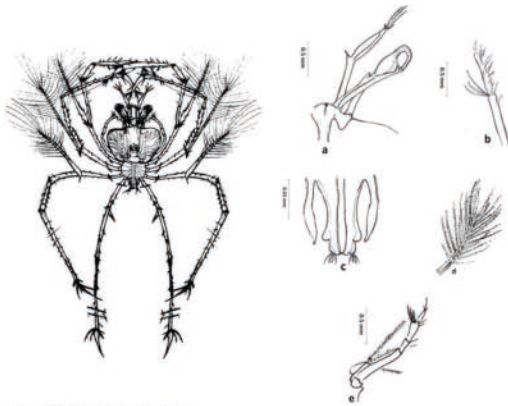
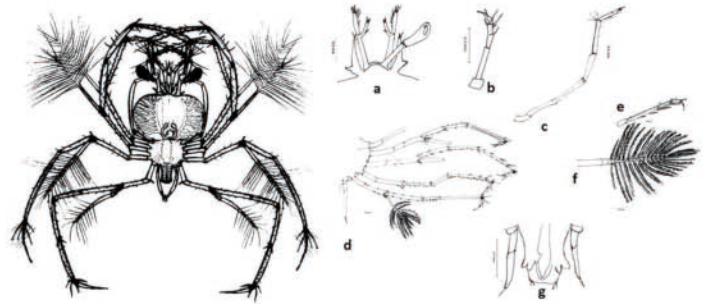


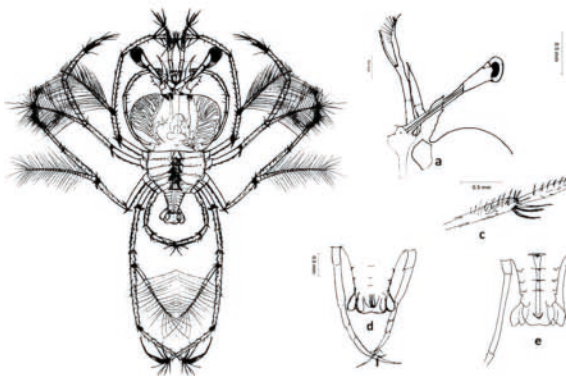
Larval and post-larval stages of *Thenus unimaculatus* (Burton & Davie 2007)



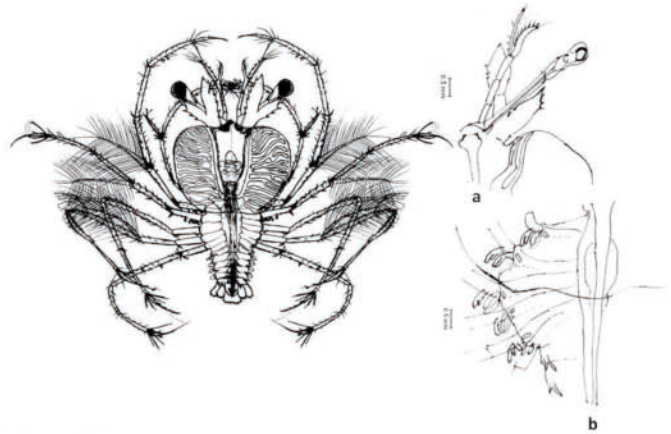
Phyllosoma I of *Thenus unimaculatus*

 e. II maxilla and III maxilliped



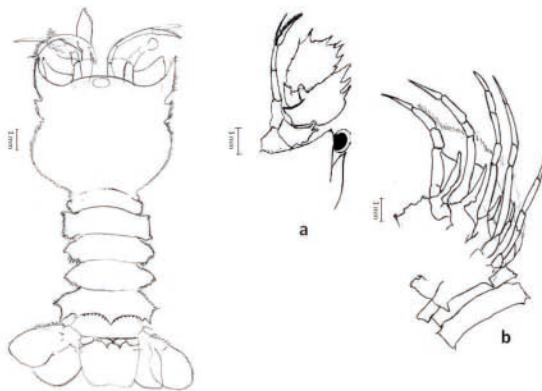
Phyllosoma II of *Thenus unimaculatus*

 g. abdomen with pereiopod V



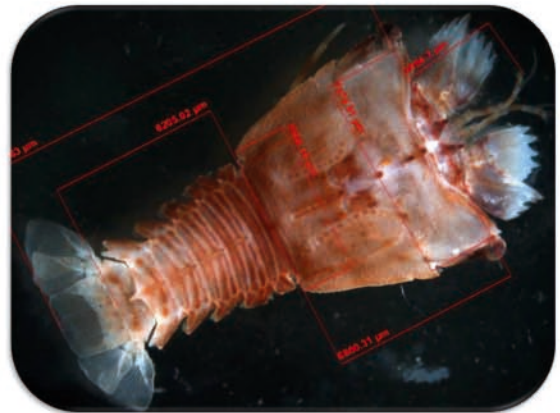
Phyllosoma III of *Thenus unimaculatus*
