SAFARI Symposium offers financial aid to young researchers

The Second International Symposium on Societal Applications in Fisheries and Aquaculture using Remote Sensing Imagery (SAFARI) to be hosted by Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) in Kochi from January 15 to 17 has offered financial support to young researchers to present papers in the symposium. The registration fee of selected students and young researchers will be waived besides providing a travel grant for the best research papers. The Norway-based Nansen Scientific Society will offer the financial support in this regard to promote young researchers in fisheries and ocean studies. Those interested may send their abstracts and bio-data to safari2.secretariat@gmail.com on or before November 30. In addition to this, special awards will be given to the best research papers and posters during the symposium. Applications are also invited from the registered participants to attend a two-day hands-on training programme on using satellite data prior to the symposium which will be held on January 12 and 13 at CMFRI.
