#### Successful breeding of groupers

Success has been achieved in breeding the grouper "Epinephelus tauvina" in the onshore indoor recirculating culture facility at the mariculture field laboratory. Cochin, It is the first attempt of breeding of protogynous marine finfish in the country. Groupers realise high prices in the export market. After a 3 year long experiment, by undergoing sex reversa! treatment and maturation these fishes spawned spontaneously (without inducing the function of spawning), in captivity. A total of 2,00,000 viable eggs were released in one batch of spawning. Ceni percent fertilisation was observed. Eggs hatched out after 22 nours and larval rearing experiments are under way.

#### RESEARCH HIGHLIGHTS

#### Successful breeding of clown fish

The Vizhinjam Research Centre and Mandapam Regional Centre have been successful in the breeding of clown fish Amphiprion chrysogaster, a potential marine ornamental fish in captivity. Larval rearing techniques are witnessing success at Vizhinjam and Mandapam. Few larvae metamorphosed and attained the juvenile stage. A batch of tarvae has reached 6-8 mm size.

Breeding and spawning of cuttle fish, Sepiella inermis in the laboratory of Tuticorin was achieved for the first time. Eggs collected from wild were maintained in the laboratory. Mating and spawning occured after a period of two months. Hatchlings were reared on mysids initially and later on acetes. The

hatchlings attained maturity in 75 days. This achievement widens the scope for promoting cephalopod culture in India.

#### Technological Advances in Pearl Oyster

A good settlement of pearl oyster spats was observed close to off Kaswar Island wherein pearl oyster spats were sea ranched during 1985-89.

About 6 lakh pearl oysters have been supplied to Mandapam for pearl culture work.

For culture work at Vizhinjam 15000 pearl oysters were transported from Tuticorin

An air-conditioned pearl system surgery room was established and made operational at Manaapam.

eral marine fintish species with special emphasis on groupers, a commercially important fish. The complex has specially designed concrete tanks of 2.2m depth with an efficient recirculation system with biological filters through which high quality of water is maintained.

It is also equipped with facili-

ties for spawning, larval rearing and nursery rearing of commercially important marine organisms. Mass production and maintenance of live feeds like phytoplankton and zooplankton will be taken up to produce the required amounts of food for larval rearing.

This multipurpose hatchery complex is well equipped with modern facilities to conduct advance research on broodstock development, larval culture and seed production of commercially important marine fishes, crustaceans and molluscs. Other facilities include conference hall, air conditioned biotechnology lab and instrumentation room and micro algal stock culture laboratory for maintaining pure culture of marine micro algae under aseptic conditions.
