

## AGRICULTURE MINISTERS VISIT CMFRI



Director CMFRI, Prof. (Dr.) Mohan Joseph Modayil welcomes the guests of honour

The Institute was honoured by the visit of the Honourable Union Minister for Agriculture, Shri Ajit Singh, the Honourable Minister of State for Agriculture, Shri Hukumdeo Narayan Yadav, a six member Parliamentary Panel and the Director General of ICAR, Dr. Panjab Singh on 2<sup>nd</sup> July.

A traditional welcome was accorded to the visiting dignitaries at the Institute. The distinguished guests were taken round the laboratories by Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil, Director, CMFRI. Scientists of CMFRI and CIFT explained the programmes and activities of the respective Institutes. Models displaying the ongoing research projects in Mariculture were demonstrated to the visiting dignitaries. They were also

apprised of the achievements made on the research front by the CMFR Institute.

Addressing the staff, the Union Agriculture Minister called upon the researchers to translate their research results into practical use for the benefit of the fishermen and further stressed the need for commercialization of research works by the Institutes. The Minister also called for better use of Information Technology in the sector. In his address, the Union Minister of State for Agriculture, Shri Hukumdeo Narayan Yadav, said that traditional knowledge of farmers in the country should be updated for achieving better results in the agriculture sector. Dr. Panjab Singh lauded the contribution of the scientists in the overall development of marine fisheries sector.

#### RESEARCH HIGHLIGHTS

## Mussel Farming: Techno-economic feasibility in coastal villages

The coastal fishers were reluctant to adopt the open sea mussel farming technology for fear of losing the farm structure due to unpredicted oceanic phenomena and poaching of farm stock. Under the situation, the Institute decided to test the feasibility of mussel farming in the calm and biologically productive estuarine ecosystem. With advantages like ready availability of seed, cheap farm materials and short grow out period, the people of Kerala tried to adopt this technology in their villages.

50 % subsidy and a repayment period of five years at 12.5% interest per annum. Equipped with financial aid, the women SHG's have contributed significantly to the development of mussel farming in the state.

The number of mussel ropes per farm vary between 300 and 900 with the yield ranging from 28 to 40 tonnes depending upon the initial stocking. Stocking starts during December- January when the salinity in coastal waters vary from 25 to 28 ppt. Initially the entire stock was harvested by the beginning of June before the onset of monsoon forcing the farmers to sell the product at a very low price. The farmers

The CMFR Institute through constant interactions with the state fisheries officials, local planners and aquaculture developmental agencies made this farming system popular in the coastal districts of Kerala. Financial assistance was given to women Self Help Groups (SHG's) which presently is under the SGRY (Swarnajayanthi Gramaswa Rosgar Yojana) scheme. Agriculture loans from farmers cooperative banks have also helped the farmers. The amount sanctioned for mussel farming by the banks range between Rs. 8,000 and Rs.9,000 per member with 40 to

were mainly depending on government agencies for marketing their produce. To solve the marketing problems, they have phased out the harvesting to a longer period from April till the onset of monsoon in June, with the farmers harvesting 5 to 10 ropes per day and selling it to women vendors who sell it in the local markets. The farmers feel that the government should help them by providing deep freezing facility to store the mussel and sell it more profitably during the monsoon period.

The Institute has set up eight demofarms and conduct trainings in

selected villages every year. The Institute also offer training programmes for state fisheries and bank officials so that they are well equipped to process the applications of farmers seeking financial assistance. All the efforts put in has been fruitful and the state today produces more than 800 tonnes of farmed mussels annually. More than 250 families in Kasargod, Kannur, Kozhikode, Thrissur, Malappuram, Tellicherry and Ernakulam districts are now the proud owners of mussel farms. In the serene coastal regions of Kerala, mussel farming has established itself as a part time avocation earning the trust of the villagers.

## Technology implementation in the backyard

The Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute, Cochin has trained farmers of Chettuva (Trichur District in Kerala) in edible oyster and green mussel farming right from 1996. Since then few farmers were practicing small scale farming of mussels in the estuary. This year a farmer from Chettuva collected mussel seeds from the Light House Beach of Anjangadi and released 125 ropes of 1 meter seeded length in racks erected in the estuarine creek behind his house in 50 sq. km area in December 2001 investing Rs. 15,000 for rack materials, seed cost and labour charges. The tended stock harvested from April upto early June came to a total of 1 tonne mussels fetching around Rs. 40,000. For selling the mussels, he has adopted a novel way of hanging the harvested mussel ropes on the side of the National Highway so as to attract consumers. Another farmer has also sold 800 kg of farmed mussels at the same area. Many farmers intend to take up mussel farming in the next season.

#### On the way to larger pearls

Broodstock of pearl oyster reached a maximum size of 80-90

mm under captivity at Visakhapatnam Regional Centre and the stock is ready for implantation with 6-8 mm beads.

#### Breeding and culture of sea horse

The first generation baby sea horse produced at the Mandapam Regional Centre of the Institute during January and February 2001 reared in 5 t FRP tanks and fed on mysids and Artemia has grown to sizes between 123 and 128 mm and attained maturity after one year. In January 2002 more than 50% of the above F1 generation sea horse spawned under captivity. The second generation sea horse babies fed on Artemia juveniles progressed from 37 to 46 mm in 3 months.

#### TRANSFER OF TECHNOLOGY

## Training for practicing farmers and rural youth

Krishi Vigyan Kendra of the CMFR Institute at Narakkal imparted training to 771 participants through conducting 31 courses under four disciplines. The number of courses and beneficiaries are as follows: Fisheries – 10 : 281; Agriculture – 10 : 278; Home Science – 8: 163; Animal Science – 3: 49.

KVK organised 5 collaborative training courses in association with different agencies as indicated: (1) Shrimp farming with Brackishwater Fish Farmers Development Agency on 3rd January: (2) Medicinal plant cultivation and their uses with Tapovanam, an NGO for youth development on 18-19 January: (3) Vegetable cultivation with Krishi Bhavan on 28-29 January: (4) Kitchen gardening with Krishi Bhavan on 30-31 January: (5) Coastal bio-resource development with Central Institute of Fisheries Education, Mumbai from 17th to 19th April.

Under the Institute Village Linkage Programme (IVLP). KVK conducted ten training courses through which 50 male and 46 female farmers were trained in the disciplines of Fisheries, Agriculture and Animal Sciences. The programme was implemented during January-March for 50 families on five interventions namely (1) Monoculture of shrimp in tidefed ponds; (2) Polyculture of fin fishes in tidefed ponds; (3) Freshwater ornamental fish culture in tanks; (4) Performance of hybrid breed of poultry and (5) Nutrient management in coconut farms. In a coastal village of Narakkal two immunisation camps were arranged (i) on 4th June for the prevention of foot and mouth disease in cattle and (ii) on 28-29 June for the prevention of Raniket disease in poultry.

## Training on seaweed farming for fisherfolk

FEM Division of CMFRI and KVK. Narakkal imparted training on the cultivation, processing and industrial utilization of the seaweed, *Gracilaria edulis*. Seaweed recipes were also taught to 15 male and 10 female fisherfolk from the local village who attended the programme from 25th to 27th February.

Mandapam Regional Centre organised trainings on Agar production for 10 fisherfolk of Kunjarvalasai (27 December 2001– 2 January 2002) and two programmes on seaweed culture for 25 fisherfolk each of Ramasamimadam (25 February – 1 March) and Nalupanai (15-20 April).

#### Trainings for nominated Government and non-Government officials

Short term courses were organised by the Trainers' Training Centre of the Institute on the following topics:

Ornamental fish culture -

Three courses of 6 days duration in January, March and June conducted at Calicut imparted training to 48 participants in the following aspects: (i) breeding and rearing; (ii) scientific aquarium management; (iii) live feed culture (iv) disease diagnosis and curing; (v) packing and transportation.

**Mussel farming** - Two courses of 2 days duration in March and April at Calicut imparted training to 17 male and 23 female participants on the rope, raft and rack culture methods.

**Crab culture** - A six day programme in Cochin trained fourteen participants in (i) handling techniques, (ii) crab fattening and (iii) transportation of both live and processed forms.

## Training for Scientists Probationers

As part of the 74 FOCARS Training of National Academy of Agricultural Research Management (NAARM). Hyderabad, 9 ARS scientists probationers underwent their Field Experience Training (FET) at the Institute for 21 days (4 · 24 March).

#### Staff Research Council

The 9th reconstituted Staff Research Council meeting of the Institute was held on 27-28 June at Cochin. The progress of work done in the ongoing research projects of the Institute, research projects sponsored by funding agencies and consultancy and contract research projects was reviewed. The heads of divisions, officers-in-charge of Regional/Research Centres and all principal investigators attended the meeting.

#### Eighth Meeting of the IJSC

Eighth meeting of the Institute Joint Staff Council of CMFRI was held on 11<sup>th</sup> February at the Mumbai Research Centre. Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil, Chairman, IJSC presided over the meeting. Representatives from official and staff side attended the meeting.

#### NATP Projects Reviewed

Peer Review Team headed by former Directors of CMFRJ. Dr. E.G. Silas (Chairman) and Dr. M. Devaraj and the members of the Scientific Advisory Panel, Dr. Alfred Selvakumar and Dr. T.C. Santiago visited CMFRI, Cochin and reviewed the progress and achievements made in all PSR mode and IVLP projects funded under the Coastal Agro Ecosystem Directorate (20-21 May). The team members visited IVLP sites at Elankunnapuzha. Dr. E.G. Silas inaugurated two Women Self Help Groups involved in the preparation of value added products.

#### Site Committee Meeting

The second Site Committee Meeting of the IVLP and ATIC was held under the chairmanship of Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil, at this Institute on 18th June. Dr. Chandra Gowda, Senior Scientist represented the Zonal Co-ordination Unit, Bangalore. The annual progress achieved was reviewed and the second phase of interventions to be implemented was presented. The committee approved the interventions of the second phase of IVLP.

In the discussions that followed, scientists, technical staff and students actively participated and the suggestions which emerged recorded for identifying prospective researchable issues.

#### Seminar on Mussel Culture

A seminar on 'Mussel culture in Malabar — Prospects and Constraints' was jointly organised by TTC and Calicut Research Centre of CMFRI at Calicut on 14th May. The seminar inaugurated by Shri A. Sujanapal, MLA was attended by officials of state fisheries departments, grama panchayat presidents and members, mussel farmers and researchers on molluscan mariculture. Apart from scientific presentations, there were discussions on the problems faced by the farmers and issues related to mussel farming. A booklet on 'Mussel Culture in North Kerala' prepared by Dr. P.K. Asokan was released by Shri A. Sujanapal.

#### National Workshop on Field Data Collection

A three day workshop was held for the field staff engaged in resources data collection of Fishery Resources Assessment Division posted at the different Regional Centres. Research Centres and Field Centres of the Institute at the Headquarters from 4th to 6th June. All staff members of the Division at Headquarters, representatives of other divisions of the Institute and 90 field staff participated. The workshop was formally inaugurated by Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil on 4th June. Field staff was divided into three separate groups and three simultaneous sessions were conducted. These groups discussed in detail, the fishing activities in each zone, introduction of new craft/gear, formation of new landing centres in their zone, non-existence of earlier landing centres, methods of improving data collection and recording and other related issues. A separate session was particularly arranged for updating their knowledge in field level identification of marine species and a field trip was made to Cochin Fisheries Harbour and Fort Cochin. Decisions were made on all vital information on data collection, processing and dissemination of processed results.

#### **Workshop on Sea Turtles**

Under the GOI-UNDP Sea Turtle Project, the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute, Cochin conduct-

ed a Workshop on 'Capacity Building Training for the front line staff of wildlife, fisheries and research organization of the west coast of India and Lakshadweep' during 19-21 June at Cochin, jointly with Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun, The workshop was sponsored by the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India. Prof. (Dr.) K.V. Peter, Vice Chancellor, Kerala Agricultural University inaugurated the Workshop. Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil, Director, CMFRI, presided over the function. Dr. N.R. Menon. Director, C-IMCOZ, Cochin University of Science & Technology offered felicitation. The workshop imparted training by the resource personnel from CMFRI, CIFT, MPEDA, WII & Coast Guard to 50 frontline and field staff of wildlife, fisheries and research organization of west coast of India and Lakshadweep in the protection of sea turtle, fishery interface problems, monitoring breeding/nesting grounds, community participation and educational programming towards sea turtle conservation. The workshop also provided a forum to share and exchange experiences in the area of sea turtle conservation and management.

#### Workshop on Impact of Dams

Technical review of the NATP project on 'Impact of dams on the river run off into the sea and change in the nutrient and productivity profile of coastal waters' was conducted at Mangalore Research Centre of CMFRI on 14th and 15th of May. Results of the work done for one year on water quality, sediment chemistry, phytoplankton, zooplankton and benthos was presented followed by discussions including suggestions for improvement.

#### Working Group Meeting and Workshop on Mangrove Ecosystem Biodiversity

A working group meeting (WGM) on NATP project 'Mangrove Ecosys-

tem Biodiversity' was conducted at CMFRI, Cochin from 16th to 18th April. During the meeting, common minimum programmes for physicochemical and biological parameters has been formulated in order to generate uniform data on the mangroves of Kerala, West Bengal (Sunderbans) and Andaman-Nicobar Islands for better comparison. In connection with the WGM, the project personnel from Kerala and West Bengal visited the mangrove ecosystem at Chettuva on 18th April.

Under the project, CMFRI sponsored a workshop at Vidyasagar University, Midnapur, West Bengal during 8-9 June. During the workshop, a manual on 'Research Methodology for Mangrove Ecosystem Biodiversity' has been released. In connection with the workshop, the participants from CARI, Port Blair; CMFRI, Cochin and Vidyasagar University, Midnapur visited the Sunderbans mangrove ecosystem during 10-12 June.

## National Project Proposed on Elasmobranchs

In view of the ban imposed on the exploitation of Elasmobranch species and the consequent issues raised by several interest groups, the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India called a meeting of all the stakeholders. The problems of implementing such a ban in view of the lacunae in the knowledge on these resources were discussed by the Institute. The Ministry agreed to fund a Research Project on Elasmobranchs. The Demersal Fisheries Division of the Institute prepared a project proposal and the project finalization meeting funded by the Ministry was held on 17-18 February at CMFRI. Shri S.C. Sarma, Additional Director General of Forests (WL) and experts from ZSI, FSI, MPEDA, CIFT, NGO's and CMFRI participated. Based on the deliberations, the proposal for a research project was finalised.

#### Entrepreneurs and Industrialists Meet

Meeting of Entrepreneurs and Industrialists in Marine Fisheries was conducted at the Institute Head-quarters on 13th March. The meeting discussed the research needs of the stakeholders in marine fisheries and mariculture, identified areas of mutual interests and explored the possibilities of investments in marine fisheries sector. A team of scientists from the Institute interacted with the farmers and industrialists.

#### Crab Harvest Mela

A Harvest Mela of the farm grown crabs under the IVLP Project implemented at Elankunnapuzha Village of Vypeen Island was inaugurated by Dr. Mohan Joseph Modayil, on 25<sup>th</sup> January. Crab farming technology adopted was assessed in 10 farmers' ponds with an area of 30 cents each. The initially stocked crabs weighing 250 grams each and fed on trash fish attained a weight of 1 to 1.3 kg. within a period of 5-6 months. The farmers realised an income of Rs. 41,000/- from the pond.

Dr. S.D. Tripathi, member, Research Advisory Council made a visit to IVLP Sites at Elankunnapuzha on 14th February and appreciated the work done by the IVLP team and the progress made.


