

Preface



Data is the *sine qua non* of good governance and data generation is a formidable task. Though conducting the National Marine Fisheries Census 2016 has been a challenging endeavour, we at ICAR-Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute are bestowed with such rich experience and vast expertise in big data management including the first survey of marine fishing villages and marine fish landings centres carried out during 1948-'49, that, this mammoth task could be accomplished as a remarkably rewarding as well as enriching achievement. While the huge, but systematic data base generated is of utmost significance for governance-oriented decision making at the Central as well as State levels, the process itself has offered us unique opportunities for strengthening our bonds with the stakeholders—the large majority of fishers in remote, mostly under-developed and environmentally challenged coastal villages. Despite the hardships, our staff members had to endure during the enumeration, the exercise could be taken to its logical end only because of the whole hearted cooperation extended by the fisherfolk and allied stakeholders of the nation.

I am happy to acknowledge the immense support and interest shown by the fisherfolk and allied stakeholders of the state who patiently provided all the required information to our staff members on the census job. The interface was well-mediated by the equally helpful assistance from the officials of the Department of Fisheries, Daman and Diu. Having conducted the Marine Fisheries Census in 2005 and 2010 with due funding support from the then Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries (DADF), Government of India, we were well equipped to address any operational issues that may crop up during enumeration. Nevertheless, our staff members were provided with sufficient skill enhancement trainings, well prior to their systematic deployment in the field. It is pertinent to provide a glimpse into the kind of preparations we have undertaken for this exercise. Across the nine maritime states and two union territories, we developed census data collection forms in different languages, dispatched them to different centers, printed notices in vernacular languages, gave media circulation, coordinated census enumeration at all the locations,

made necessary supervisions, collected the forms back and finally brought them to the headquarters at Kochi for data digitization and data processing. The National Marine Fisheries Data Centre of ICAR-CMFRI coordinated the data entry, compilation and analysis. The entire scientific, technical, administrative and supporting staff of the Fishery Resources Assessment Division ably led by the division Head, Dr. T. V. Sathianandan, who made remarkable contributions in coming out with the census reports. Special thanks are due to all the scientific, technical, administrative and supporting staff of ICAR-CMFRI for their sincere involvements in the successful conduct of the census.

Once again, I am expressing my sincere thanks to the DADF, Govt of India (presently the Department of Fisheries – DoF) who supported by funding the census programme, ICAR officials who encouraged the activities, the entire CMFRI fraternity whose enthusiasm made this task a commendably collective feat.

Summary

Marine fisheries census was carried out in two districts of the Union territory of Daman & Diu during February 2016. The scope, time frame, the parameters, type of schedules used are described in Marine Fisheries Census 2016 India Report. The significant features are summarized below.

Fishing villages and landing centres

- There are 12 marine fishing villages in the U. T. of Daman & Diu, in which Diu and Daman share 6 each.
- There are 8 landing centres in Daman & Diu, of which Daman has 5 and Diu has 3.

Population

- There are 3,163 marine fishermen families in the U. T., of which Daman have 438 families and Diu have 2,725 families.
- The total marine fisherfolk population in the U. T., is 15,836, out of which adult male constitute 34.5%, adult female 32.3% and children 33.2%
- Of the total fisherfolk population, Diu accounts for 87.4% and Daman for 12.6%.
- Among 3,163 fishermen families, 98% are traditionally into fishing.
- The average number of families in a village is 264, with 1,320 persons per village.

- The average family size is 5 with both districts having the same.
- Females form 48% of the population and female to male ratio is 938 per 1,000 males. This ratio is 944 in Diu and 899 in Daman.

Poverty

- In the U. T., there are 20 families below poverty line and nearly all of them are in Daman (18).

Education

- In Diu, 79% of the eligible fisherfolk are educated with different levels of education.
- About 22% of the eligible fisherfolk have education up to primary level, 50% have education upto higher secondary level, 4% have above higher secondary level education and 2% are graduates & above. The rest 21% of the population are unschooled.

Occupation

- There are 3,867 active marine fishermen in Daman & Diu, of whom an overwhelming 3,683 are full time fishermen, 95 are part-time and the rest are engaged in fish seed collection.
- Among the occupied (4,630), 83% of the fisherfolk are engaged in active fishing and 14% in fishing allied activities and 3% in other areas not related to fishery.

- There are 632 fisher folk engaged in fishing allied activities, such as marketing, making/ repairing net, curing/processing and labourers.
- Women outweigh men in fishing allied activities, accounting about 86%. Among the major fishing allied activities, women dominate in marketing of fish.

Aquaculture activities

- Census revealed that one fishermen family is engaged in aquaculture and it is in Diu district.
- There are 44 fisherfolk families with formal training in aquaculture.

Religion

- Among the 3,163 families, 3,147 belong to Hinduism and 15 belong to Islam. In these, 20 families belong to SC/ST community.

Membership in co-operatives

- In the state, 9% of the adult fisherfolk are having membership in cooperative societies, out of which 85% are in fisheries cooperative societies and 15% are members in other cooperative societies.

Craft in the fishery

- There are 1,992 crafts in the fishery, of which 1,419 are mechanized, and inboard (95), outboard (301) and non-motorised form the rest.
- Trawlers (1,063), gillnetters (342) and dollnetters (14) are the main crafts in the mechanized sector.
- Trawlers mainly operate in Diu (1,045).
- In the case of Gillnetters, 83% belong to Diu and 17% belong to Daman.
- Non-motorised crafts operate in Diu only.

Craft owned by the fisherfolk

- There are 1,161 fishing crafts owned by fisherfolk, of which 777 are mechanised, 193 are inboard, 129 are outboard and 62 are non-motorised.
- Trawlers account for 82% of the mechanised crafts owned by fisherfolk, followed by gillnetters (15%), purse seiners (2%) and dolnetters (1%).
- There are only 4 fishing crafts partially owned by fisherfolk, of which 2 are mechanized and 2 are motorized.

Life saving and electronic equipment

- In Daman & Diu 2,613 marine fishermen families have life saving equipment (83.0%) and 2,606 families have mobile phones (82.0%).
- Among fisherfolk families in the state, 756 (24%) families have GPS and 18% families have wireless communication gadgets.

Infrastructure

- In Daman & Diu, 95% of the fishermen houses are pucca houses.
- 53% of the houses have less than 3 rooms and 40% of the houses do not have their own toilet facility.
- The number of houses electrified is 3,161.
- All houses are having drinking water facilities like well, tap, bore well /hand pump etc.
- There are 32 primary schools, 20 secondary schools, 4 colleges and 7 technical institutions in the fishing villages of Daman & Diu.
- All the fishing villages have cell phone coverage and 11 villages have bus stop/bus stand.
- There are 4 boat building yards, 26 ice factories, 2 freezing plants and 1 processing plant in Daman & Diu.




